



# Fiber to fabric

With this technique you can create a three dimensional effect by adding yarn on top of a foundation fabric without sewing.

### You need:

- Light blue wool foundation fabric
- Dark blue wool fabric for the stand alone flower
- Yellow wool fabric for flower fill areas
- Blue wool yarn
- Pfaff fabric marking pen part no 412 7525-01
- Printed flower template
- Printed layout design template for the front piece of the cushion
- Paper scissors
- Fabric scissors
- hobby™ 350p punchmachine

### 1 Paper pattern

Cut out the flower pattern from the template. Trace the flower on both the darker blue wool fabric and the yellow wool fabric using the Pfaff fabric marking pen.

### 2 Cutting

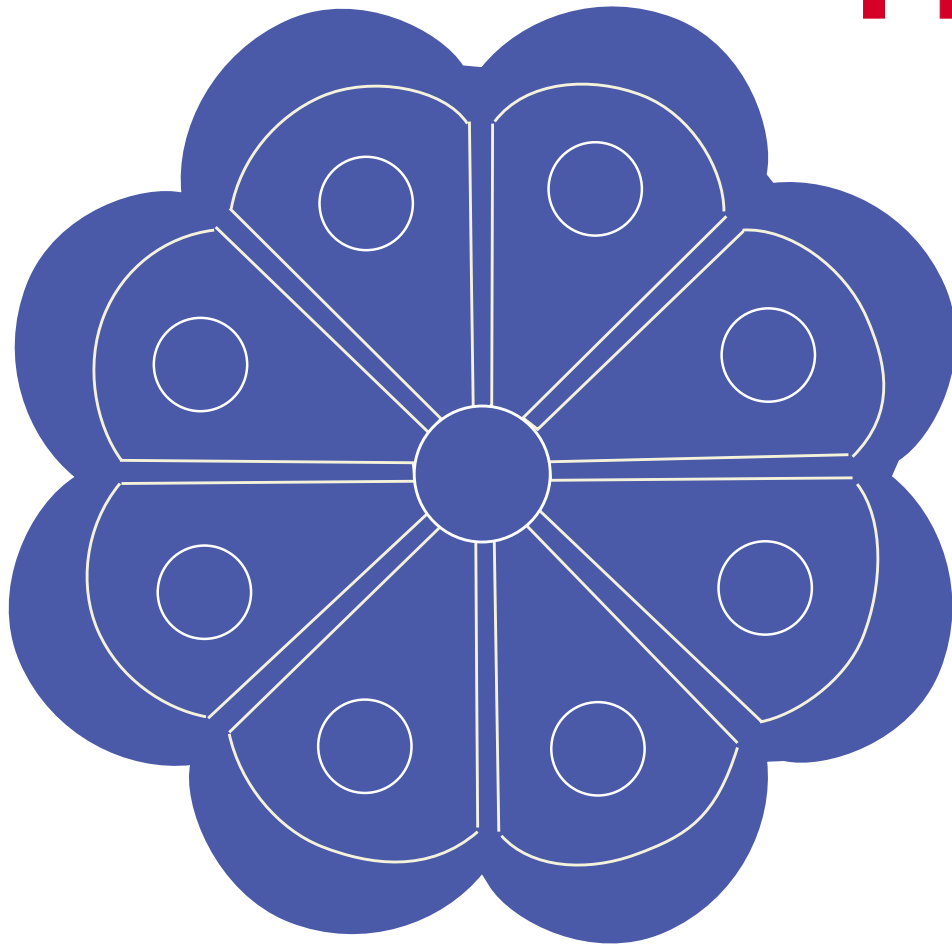
- From light blue wool fabric:  
One piece 44 x 44 cm (17,5" x 17,5")
- From In dark blue wool fabric:  
The flower using the flower pattern.
- From yellow wool fabric:  
The flower fill areas using the pattern.

### 3 Embellish/felting/punching

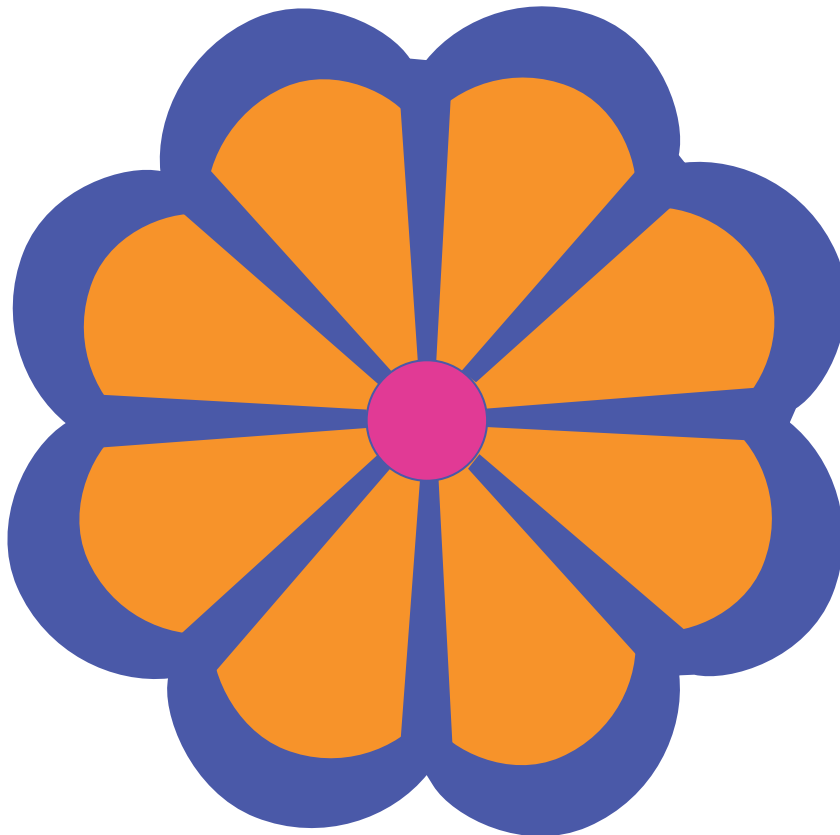
- Place the pre cut yellow fill areas on the wrong side dark blue wool flower as shown in the layout diagram.
- Start in the center of the flower and needle loosely over most of the flower to "baste" it in place. Then let the machine "needle" a lot moving over the entire flower until all yellow fill areas are securely fastened.
- Turn the flower right side up. Start punching the yarn in place. Follow the edge around all yellow areas to create a three dimensional effect on the flower. After punching around every yellow area, cut the yarn and securely attach the yarn in place by punching the yarn end.

### 4 Sewing
